



Personal Information Privacy Policy

In an effort to respond to the privacy concerns of British Columbians, the BC Government enacted the Personal Information Protection Act, which came into effect on January 1, 2004. The purpose of this privacy legislation, in general terms, is to regulate the private sector's collection, use and disclosure of personal information.

Most personal information will be collected directly from you through the registration system and forms.

Your information may be disclosed to (or may be accessible by) the association staff and volunteers for the normal operations as a Minor Hockey Association or as required by the rules and regulations of the PCAHA, BCAHA and CHA. The association will share player names, birth dates and email addresses with prescreened external service providers to support specific activities such as player evaluations and skills testing.

Not all of your information will be accessible to each of the above mentioned entities and the general public will not have access to your information.

Your personal information will only be used for purposes disclosed to you and for which we have gathered your prior consent. Should the association need to use your information for purposes other than those already listed, we will explain the purpose to you and obtain your consent - before we use it.

If you are comfortable with personal information use as described above you need only retain this notice for your records.
